# More Flights to Destination St. Vincent and the Grenadines

With its towering green hills, hues of turquoise blue seas and the romance of an authentic Caribbean experience, St. Vincent and the Grenadines is what a novice Caribbean traveler dreams of, or an seasoned traveler's 'new' adventure. The multi-island destination's remote- ness added to its unspoiled charms were not adversely altered with the opening of the Argyle International Airport in 2017.

Having welcomed weekly flights from international carriers since its operationalization, the Argyle International Airport now has an addition to its services, with the commencement of daily flights from American Airlines. The Miami-St. Vincent nonstop route started on March 1st is a welcomed addition as international arrivals approach prepandemic levels. 2023 promises exciting tourism development in St. Vincent and the Grenadines.

Similarly increased access to the destination is now available to regional visitors, with the increased services by InterCaribbean Airways on 12 March. The regional carrier's Embraer – 120 aircraft, with a seating capacity of 30, will operate on Sunday, Wednesday and Friday, connecting the eastern and



western Caribbean. The additional flight complements the destinations increasing air accessibility with

services with Caribbean Airlines weekly Wednesday from JFK International, USA, and Air Canada Rouge's weekly Thursday non-stop flights from Pearson International, Canada.

Caribbean Airlines has also expanded its service between Barbados and St. Vincent and the Grenadines to 3 weekly return flights of Tuesdays, Thursdays and Sundays.

#### Hola desde San Vicente y las Granadinas!!

Fueled by it launch of flights to St. Vin- cent and the Grenadines in April 2022, CONVIASA Airlines has since expanded its service to include weekly flights be- tween Cuba and St. Vincent and the Grenadines.

Starting on 31st March 2023, the Venezuelan airline now includes a weekly arrival on Fri- days. This offers an exciting and new route for Cuban and other Latin Americans to discover the dreamy archipelago St. Vincent and the Grenadines, known for therapeutic black and pow- dery white sandy beaches which beautifully contrast its azure skies.

Additionally, the new route is expected to further strengthen the cultural exchanges and diplomatic relations between the two countries which was established in 1992.



### Regional travel gets a boost

Caribbean Airlines has announced increased ATR flights between St. Vincent and the Grenadines and Barbados. Effective April 3, three flights weekly will operate between the two countries on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Sundays to complement the three weekly flights from Argyle International Airport (AIA) to Port of Spain on those days. The new schedule forms part of the airline's plan to increase capacity in the Eastern Caribbean to regional travel market. The airline has also flight from JFK, New York to AIA for its summer schedule. From July, the direct flight operates from AIA on Fridays and from JFK on Saturdays.



#### **Myah Luxury Suites Hotel**

Soon visitors can whiz 15 minutes from the Argyle International Airport to the deluxe Myah's Luxurious Suite Hotel in the developing tourist area of Diamond. The 35 room property owned by Vincentian Mr. Eliot Mc Dowall, will officially open its doors in May,2023. The property boasts modern décor and design, luxe amenities inclusive of a spa, rooftop pool and restaurant. Combining a luxurious hospitality experience, with the conveniences and necessities for the modern business traveler, it also

boast a conference room with the capacity to host up 100 persons.

The newly developed property further augments the room stock on mainland St. Vincent, and compliments other tourism investments within the Diamond area, with the ongoing construction of the Holiday Inn on the island's eastern coast. The western coast will also see tourism developments with the launch- ing of internationally recognized hospitality giants Marriott International and Beaches by Sandals Resort.

#### **Toronto Raptors Caribbean Heritage Night**

On February 23<sup>rd</sup>, the SVG Tourism Authority partnered with Toronto Raptors at Caribbean Heritage Night, for their game at Scotiabank Arena.

The Government of SVG has published the Marriage Delegation of Powers Notice 2022, which is now in effect and allows for the facilitation of locals and visitors obtaining a marriage license in the Grenadines.

The Marriage Amendment Act, and now the marriage delegation of powers notices, empower revenue officers and district officers in the Grenadines to issue marriage licenses on behalf of the Governor General.



#### Tourism is Everyone's Business...Live It! Love It! Embrace It!

The Ministry of Tourism, is working to unite key public and private tourism stakeholders around a long term strategy to enhance the destination's competitive advantage.

As part of this objective, the Ministry is supporting the completion of a tourism master plan and the refurbishment of the popular historic site tourist attraction, Fort Charlotte. Other components of the consolatory undertaking will provide opportunities for the strengthening of partnerships with stakeholders, through the identification of challenges and fostering opportunities for greater collaborative initiatives. This announcement came from Minister of Tourism, Civil Aviation, Sustainable Development and Culture, Honourable Carlos James in his February press conference.

Continuing his engagements with the public, Minister James in his March press conference shared that the industry marked 84% increase yacht arrivals with the first quarter of 2023 when compared with the 2022 figures. The Minister credited this increase, particularly on the Grenadine island of Bequia to the destination's resilience during the global pandemic.

Similarly, Minister James touted the initial inbound and outbound figures for the daily American Airline flights to the destination with a load factor nearing 80% for the first operational month. The impressive uptake of the daily flights and the contributing dedicated stakeholders were lauded by the Minister of Tourism.



#### Sandals Recruits more Vincentians

During the month of January 2023 thirty-eight Vincentians were recruited by Sandals International for training. They left St. Vincent and the Grenadines and headed to a Sandals branch in the Turks and Caicos Islands.

This group will return to SVG to work at Sandals International's Beaches Resort at Buccament when the resort becomes operational by the end of 2023.

The recruitments by Sandals International are part of an agreement between the global hotel giant's Executive Chairman, Mr. Adam Stewart and the Government of St. Vincent and the Grenadines to hire 500 Vincentians in advance of the scheduled opening.

trade to the multi-island state. The destination opened its first international airport in 2017, and has since been regularly serviced by international carriers American Airlines, Air Canada and Virgin Atlantic along with regional airlines Caribbean Airlines, LIAT, InterCaribbean and CONVIASA.

The premier annual event dedicated to the global cruise industry "Sea Trade Cruise Global" was held from 27- 30 March 2023. The four-day conference which was held in Miami, is the opportune event for discussions with high-level cruise executives and connects destinations and cruise executives for over 80 + cruise brands.

Our destination's contingent included both private sector and public sector officials. Minister of Tourism Hon. Carlos James led the delegation which also included, Permanent Secretary in the Ministry of Tourism Dr. Resa Noel-Mc Barnett and CEO of the SVG Tourism Authority Mr. Glen Beache. St. Vincent and the Grenadines is scheduled to receive a record 314 calls for the 2022- 2023 cruise seasons, with a record 13 inaugural visits to the destination.

### **Discover SVG Diving in New Jersey**



St. Vincent and the Grenadines staged its annual exhibit at the Beneath the Sea Dive, Travel and Oceans Exposition on March 25 and 26, 2023. The 2-day show attracted divers and non-divers and presented scuba diving updates, volunteer initiatives, equipment, and vacation destinations that offer diving as a tourism experience. The Discover St. Vincent and the Grenadines exhibit was among 11 Caribbean dive destinations and a total of 160 dive industry stakeholders who exhibited at the largest consumer dive exposition in the USA.

# **Discover SVG in Washington DC**

St. Vincent and the Grenadines has completed an exhibit at the Washington Convention Center in the US capital. The consumer travel exhibition, the Travel & Adventure Show, was held on February 4-5, 2023 and saw SVG exhibiting among 12 Caribbean countries. Some 15,000 persons attended the 2-day event, including close to 300 travel advisors and 1,100 travel trade professionals. Consumers and travel advisors were engaged through the distribution of marketing collateral and the sharing of general information on the destination. Contacts were also exchanged with travel advisors and travel writers/influencers.
